

Policies and Procedures

The Occupational Therapy department's policy on **Equitable Treatment** is in accordance with the university's policy published in the [Student Handbook](#), which states that:

“Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which exemplifies respect for people of all races, religions, and ethnic groups, and to adhere to one's personal values without duly imposing them on others.

Students shall not be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, creed, age, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, disability, religion, or national origin. Students are entitled to work and study in an atmosphere free from unsolicited and unwelcome sexual overtones or innuendoes.”
