Academic Warning, Probation, and Dismissal

Academic Warning

Graduate students in academic jeopardy are notified through conferences or in writing by the course faculty member, Advisor, and/or the Coordinator of the PhD Program. The progress of graduate students notified of unsatisfactory academic performance is monitored by the faculty Advisor, and/or the Coordinator of the PhD Program.

A graduate student whose cumulative GPA falls below 3.0 will be placed on Academic Warning by the University.

Academic Probation

A student on Academic Warning whose cumulative GPA remains below 3.0 in the following semester will be placed on Academic Probation by the University. To remove the Academic Probation status, a student must attain a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or above in the subsequent semester.

Dismissal

A graduate student on probation whose cumulative and semester GPAs fall below a 3.0 will be automatically dismissed from the Program and University.
